

Short Course in Fire Warden

PUAFER005 Operate as part of an emergency control organisation

Course Overview

This course applies to educators and support staff working in education or children's services who are required to respond in the event of a first aid emergency. This includes early childhood workers and educators who work with school age children in outside school hours care and vacation programs.

Duration

This is a blended course with self-paced e-Learning and face-to-face training and assessment. Before attending for face-to-face, students will need to complete their e-Learning.

Course Content

This course provides the skills and knowledge required to respond to emergencies in the workplace, as a Fire Warden.

Topics Include:

- Assessing a facility for emergency preparedness
- Identify emergency situations
- Basics of alarm systems and operating as a member of an emergency control organisation
- Initiating an appropriate response to emergencies
- Emergency evacuation of a facility



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Assessment Methods

Online theory assessments and face-to-face practical assessment.

Note: the provision of Adult and Child CPR must be demonstrated on the floor.

Course Materials

Training is supported through the provision of quality learning materials and resources.

Students undertaking this short course should wear comfortable, casual clothing. This course will include activities such as bending, kneeling and lying on the floor. Students will also require access to a computer or tablet with internet connection to complete the theory component of the course.
